

Named one of 2020's "Rising Stars" by BBC Music Magazine, flutist Lara Deutsch is a versatile soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player known for her engaging warmth and ability to connect with audiences. Recipient of the \$125,000 Prix Goyer for 2019-2020, Lara was also a first prize winner of the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal's 2014 Manulife Competition, at which she was awarded a total of seven prizes. Additionally, she was the Grand Prize Winner of both the National Arts Centre Orchestra Bursary Competition (2014) and the Canadian Music Competition (2010), as well as a laureate of the Concours Prix d'Europe (2016).

An avid chamber musician, Lara's recent performance highlights include a tenconcert tour of the Northern United Kingdom, as well as recitals for the Under the Spire Festival, the Waterside Summer Music Series, the Scotia Festival of Music, New Classical FM's Zoomer Hall series, the National Arts Centre (NAC) & Facebook's #CanadaPerforms initiative, Newport Classical (Rhode Island, USA), the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal's Virée Classique, Chamberfest, Music & Beyond, and the Allegra Chamber Music series, of which she was Artist-in-Residence for the 2019-2020 season. Among her favourite collaborators are pianists Philip Chiu and Frédéric Lacroix, guitarist Adam Cicchillitti, and harpist Emily Belvedere, with whom she founded Duo Kalysta. She has recorded three chamber music albums on the Leaf Music Label: Origins (2019, Duo Kalysta), Night Light (2022, with Philip Chiu), and Wanderlust (2023, with Adam Cicchillitti).

Lara is currently based in the Ottawa-Montreal area, where she has performed extensively with the NAC Orchestra, the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal, and the Ottawa Symphony Orchestra. Additionally, she has performed with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra (of which she acted as Assistant Principal Flute & Piccolo for the 2016-17 season), the symphony orchestras of Toronto, Kitchener-Waterloo, and Kingston, and the McGill Symphony Orchestra, among others.

Whenever possible, Lara enjoys performing for young audiences through educational outreach concerts. She is similarly dedicated to sharing her transformative experiences working with Olympic mental performance coach Jean-François Ménard, having hosted workshops internationally for performers of all ages. In 2020, she joined the music faculty at Carleton University as a performance instructor and, as of 2023, now serves on the faculty of the Breno Italy International Music Academy.

Lara performs on a 14k gold Haynes flute, generously loaned by Canimex Inc. of Drummondville, Québec. She is incredibly grateful for the support of Mécénat Musica, the Canada Council for the Arts, and FACTOR in her ongoing projects, as well as for the years of invaluable guidance from her principal teachers and mentors: Denis Bluteau, Tim Hutchins, Camille Churchfield, and Cathy Baerg. She is represented by Latitude 45 Arts.

Lara Deutsch is determined to change what it means to be a classical musician in the 21st century.

The moment she walks onstage, full of natural exuberance, warmth and with an infectious smile, she makes you an active part of the adventure. Lara rejects classical formality in favour of musical spontaneity, offering concerts designed to take you on a dynamic narrative journey.

Lara grew up in suburban Ottawa listening to the Backstreet Boys and Claude Debussy. At three she started piano lessons; at six she was studying flute.

She was an ace student in high school and her teachers encouraged her to study medicine. But music was her passion, with a healing power all its own.

Since completing two degrees at McGill University in Montreal, Lara has been a busy freelancer with a mantel full of major awards: first prize from l'Orchestre symphonique de Montréal's Manulife Competition and the Prix Goyer, along with the grand prize at the Canadian Music Competition and the National Arts Centre's Orchestra Bursary Competition. She's been named a "Rising Star" by BBC Music Magazine and one of the 30 best musicians under 30 by the CBC.

Lara has played with every major orchestra in the country and regularly collaborates with pianists Philip Chiu and Frédéric Lacroix, guitarist Adam Cicchillitti and harpist Emily Belvedere. Among her proudest achievements are three albums, two of which were named to Top 20 lists by CBC Music.

She credits training with a mental performance coach for much of her success. Jean François Ménard, who has coached Cirque du Soleil, Olympic athletes and major corporations all over the world, taught her how to take nervous energy and turn it into excitement, to aim for excellence instead of perfection and to feel comfortable taking artistic risks.


Mental skills training is as important as practicing scales, she believes. In addition to being on faculty at Carleton University, Lara offers workshops around the world to share her own experience with young musicians.

"If you're a musician, winning a job or competition often comes down to who does well in a two-minute audition," she says. "Olympic athletes train their entire lives for a twominute race. You need to be able to do your best in a moment of great intensity and stress. That takes practice."

Ultimately, Lara sees music as a gift that connects people, across generations, borders and backgrounds.

"Music can help us to recognize that we are not alone," she says. "I love to be a part of that process — touching the heart, even for a moment, of everyone in the audience."

This program is a tribute to our friend and colleague Jocelyn Morlock, whose untimely passing in March 2023 sent shockwaves throughout the Canadian classical music community. Weeks before her passing, she completed one of her final compositions, a commission for our trio entitled "The uses of solitude." Like much of her music, this piece addresses a deeply personal and emotional topic: the feelings of isolation and loneliness with which many struggled during the COVID-19 pandemic. In spite of this challenging theme, the piece culminates in a powerful expression of joy, re-connection, and love. Jocelyn's work is coupled with works by one of her mentees (Luis Ramirez) and one of her inspirations (Sofia Gubaidulina). This program blends new/old, joy/grief, and light/dark, with Jocelyn's memory at the centre of it all.
